(1) legislate
(2) regulate
(3) raise taxes
(4) spend taxes

RICS needs to:

- (1) manage its external profile
- (2) know the policies, processes that drive decisions
- (3) provide advice on what to say
- (4) know what to say, to whom, and when

RICS Public Affairs Committee agreed top priority- ENERGY

Energy:

Global energy demand expected to double by 2050 Global water use has trebled since 1950 By 2028 the UK will need to import 80% of its gas

Governments response:

UK & EU using full range of instruments to address environmental issues – regulation, taxes etc UK energy review

Energy Performance of Buildings Directive all new buildings let or sold to have an energy rating
